How to Install Chains on Tractors





1-Lay the chains out so the studs are facing the ground and the chains are centered on the tires. If on cement as shown, jack it up not to damage the concrete. If on the ground, tie a rope to the end links, loop the rope over the tire threads and slowly roll your chains on. Be sure once on that they are centered on the tire.



2-Once on, roll the tire and cut the excess chain.



3-Start by tightening the inside chain then the outer side chains and tighten.



4-Use the inc. boomers and links to tighten chains.



5-Make sure you have a min. of 1 1/2" of clearance not to damage your fenders.



* 2 Alloy studs per link!

6-Keep your excess chains for spare parts that will provide you with years of service.
